- Financial Aid awarded by Grossmont College will only fund courses taken at Grossmont College. Students may take courses at Cuyamaca with advance approval. Such approval is provided by filing a Consortium Agreement. Here are a few of the restrictions of a Consortium Agreement.
 - You must be enrolled in 6 or more units between the two colleges.
 - All courses you take at Cuyamaca must apply toward your academic goal declared at Grossmont.
 - You must maintain enrollment in at least 1 course at Grossmont or the agreement will be canceled.

Email

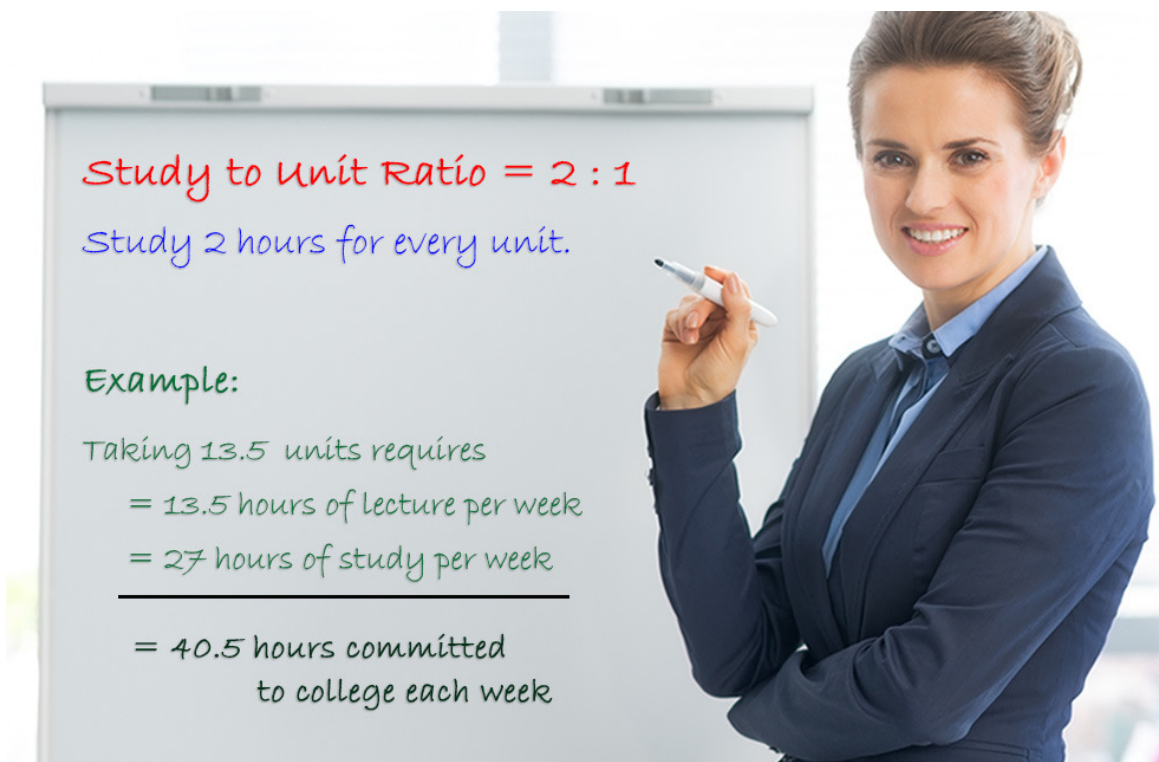
- Student Email is a web-based e-mail client that provides you with access to your Grossmont email using Internet Explorer. This allows access to your email from any location, any time.
- Authentication to your e-mail is possible via your Grossmont College Student User ID and password.

Parking

- At Grossmont campus parking lots, all vehicles must display a valid college parking permit while parked on campus property.
 - Student parking permits are purchased online through your student WebAdvisor account. From there you will be linked to Credentials, Inc., where you may pay by credit card online or you may pay by cash or check if you bring in your printed order form to the College Cashier's office where we will process your payment and your permit will be mailed to you.

Units

- A unit is a measurement of college work. One unit translates to approximately one hour of in-class time each week.
- For example, if you are taking a three-unit class, you can expect to spend about three hours in class each week for the entire semester.
 - Keep in mind that the number of hours per unit doesn't include outside study time needed to be successful in your class."
